Aliso Road	Main entrance to Ranch	Sloan's Gate	2.1	456	456	675	675	Asphalt road beginning at main ranch entrance, proceeding past Main Bridge at stables (.4 miles, elev. 500'), past first gate and cattle guard (.5 miles, elev. 500'), past second gate with combination lock (.9 miles, elev. 525'), past Red Barn on left (1.3 miles, elev. 575'), past third gate and cattle guard (1.4 miles, elev. 600'), past junction for Charlie Watson Road on left and Lloyd's Canyon Trail on right (1.5 miles, elev. 600'), across first rail car bridge (1.7 miles, elev. 600'), past junction to Mud Springs on left (1.8 miles, elev. 625'), past junction Joe Wilson Trail (1.9 miles, elev. 650'), across second rail car bridge (2.0 miles, elev. 650'), and end at Sloan's Gate (2.1 miles, elev. 675').
Andy's Flats Trail	Junction with Oak Peak Trail	Junction with Charlie Watson Road	1.6	750	750	1850	1800	Combination of dozer track, trail, and cross country travel beginning at junction with Oak Peak Trail, moves past water troughs (150', elev. 800'), up trail through oaks, across pasture meadow, continues up ridge past horizontal tank (1.4 miles, elev. 1,850'), until it ends at junction with Charlie Watson Road (1.6 miles, elev. 1,800'). Route consists of some of best vistas and oak savannah on the ranch. This is also one of the richest wildlife areas with numerous chances to see deer and pig.

Charlie Watson Road	Junction with Aliso Road	Gate and junction with Leon Canyon Trail	2.6	575	550	1800	1800	Graded dirt road that begins at junction with Aliso Road (200 feet north of Red Barn cattle guard and gate), moves westerly across Aliso Creek to gate (.2 miles, elev. 625'), continues to second creek crossing (.3 miles, elev. 575'), continues steady but easy grade past water troughs (.4 miles, elev. 600'), junction with Oak Peak trail (.6 miles, elev. 675'), pole barn, water troughs, pump station (.9 miles, elev. 850'), junction with Willis Ridge Route (2.2 miles, elev. 1,525'), and ends at gate (2.6 miles, elev. 1,800'). Continuing though gate provides access to Deer Camp and additional trails. A right turn towards the horizontal tank before going through gate puts you on the Andy's Flats Trail. Route is open vista and the most gradual climb for continuing to western destinations on ranch. Provides access to Oak Peak and adjoining trails as well as Willis Ridge Route, Deer Camp and upper end of Andy's Flats trail.
Joe Wilson Trail	Junction with Aliso Road	Junction with Oak Peak Trail	1.2	650	650	800	800	Combination of graded dirt road, dozer track, and trail that moves north and westerly from junction with Aliso Road .2 miles north of first rail car bridge, proceeds through gate (.2 miles, elev. 650'), past pond (.3 miles, elev. 700'), cattle pens (.4 miles, elev. 700'), and continues as minimal trail just inside the Sloan fenceline with several creek crossings and ends at junction with Oak Peak Trail (1.2 miles, elev. 800'). The route continues south as Oak Peak Trail. The best junction landmark is the drop gate and No Hunting sign on Sloan's fence. Trail is just inside tree line on the right side of the creek.
Lloyds Canyon Trail	Junction with Aliso Road	Trail ends in small box canyon	0.7	575	575	700	700	Combination of dozer track, trail, and cross country travel beginning at junction with Aliso Road at same mile point as Charlie Watson Road, trail moves easterly to gate (.1 miles, elev. 625'), and proceeds along the level bottom of Lloyds canyon to terminus in grassy box canyon. Route is woodland and creek bottom. Provides access to Andy's Flats, Twisted Gorge, other minor trails to west and Joe Wilson.

Overlook Trail	Junction with Pepper Tree Road	Junction with Butt Slide Trail	2.2	600	600	1,325	1,325	Combination of graded dirt road and dozer track, that travels a semi circular route beginning at junction with Pepper Tree Road, proceeds westerly along an Edison access route past water tank and troughs (.2 miles, elev. 625'), climbs to viewpoint (1.4 miles, elev. 1200'), and rolls until ending at junction with Butt Slide Trail. Route includes excellent vistas to east and South Mountain and Santa Monica Mountains. Terrain is almost entirely California chaparral.
Pepper Tree Canyon Trail	Junction with Butt Slide Trail	Junction with Pepper Tree Road	0.9	825	625	825	625	Combination of dozer track and trail beginning at junction with Butt Slide Trail, moves past water and feed troughs to junction with Nettle Springs Trail (.3 miles, elev. 750') and continues to end at junction with Pepper Tree Road (.9 miles, elev. 625'). Route remains in the bottom of Pepper Tree Canyon and provides the connection for routes crossing or running through the canyon bottom. Route is California chaparral.

Route ends at junction with Overlook Trail (1.6 miles, elev. 600'). Route travels through open vistas, oak groves and lower portion of Pepper Tree Canyon. Provides access to Shady Branch, Pepper Tree Canyon, and Overlook trails.

This trail accesses badlands type gorges and arroyos on western portion of ranch. Route includes vistas, oak groves, and pasture meadow.

Willis Ridge Route	Gate at rear of stables	Junction with Charlie Watson Road	2.4	510	510	1650	1525	Graded dirt road that begins at rear of stables, moves northerly to gate behind residence (.1 miles, elev. 525'), turns left and climbs gradually to second gate (.4 miles, elev. 575'), proceeds to junction with Two Tanks Connector and water trough (.7 miles, elev. 675'), continues straight and begins steep climb to gate (1.0 miles, elev. 900'), and junction with Shady Branch Trail, continues westerly on ridge past junctions with Nettle Springs (1.1 miles, elev. 1,000'), and Lame Mule Trail (1.9 miles, elev. 1400'), until entering oak grove (2.0 miles, elev. 1,450'), through gate (2.1 miles, elev. 1,525'), and turn north to top of grade (2.2 miles, elev. 1,650'), and descend to end at junction with Charlie Watson Road (2.4 miles, elev. 1,525'). Route travels through open vistas, oak groves, and numerous viewpoints. Provides access to Wood Canyon, Two Tanks, Shady Branch, Nettle Springs, and Lame Mule trails, and Charlie Watson Road. Climbs over 1,000 feet in 2.2 miles.
Wood Canyon Trail	Gate behind residence and junction with Willis Ridge Route	Junction with Two Tanks Connector	1.3	525	500	775	775	Combination of trail, dozer track and graded dirt road that begins at gate behind residence at junction with Willis Ridge Route, heads towards Aliso Road then turns northerly, goes past hay barn to gate (.2 miles, elev. 550'), continues to point where trail turns up Wood Canyon (.8 miles, elev. 650'), and continues up canyon to end at junction with Two Tanks Connector (1.3 miles, elev. 775'). Open country through oak groves and meadow allows easy travel for an additional half mile up the canyon.
General Comment								Elevation information was obtained using GPS and altimeter readings. Neither source can be considered accurate for any purpose beyond indicating approximate elevations for estimating steepness. The elevations were estimated to the nearest 25' and are likely to be within 100' of the true elevation, but no guarantees.
